In June, Jason and Treneria will meet other students from across the state in Raleigh, then board a bus for Washington, D.C. While at the nation's capital, youth tourists from across the country will meet with legislators, take a harbor party cruise,

visit museums and memorials and make many friends.

"Few individuals get to experience the behind-the-scenes look at Washington, D.C. that the Youth Tour provides," said General Manager Kevin Heath. "We are delighted to be able to provide these two students with this unique opportunity."

ACT Grants Awarded

Two Albemarle Community Trust grants were recently awarded to local nonprofits that work to benefit the region.

The Food Bank of the Albemarle was the recent recipient of a \$5,000 grant from the Albemarle Community Trust. The \$5,000 grant will pay for 15,000 meals for those in need.

The Winfall Volunteer Fire Department received a \$5,000 grant to help purchase a new 800 megahertz radio for one of their fire trucks.

The Albemarle Community Trust is funded by Albemarle EMC members who voluntarily contribute through their power bills.

Before Purchasing Solar, Take these Steps

If you are planning on interconnecting solar with Albemarle EMC's grid, there are some crucial steps you first must take before work can begin.

First, you must locate the renewable interconnection documents located at www.aemc.coop under the Documents drop-down menu. Once, there click on the Renewable Interconnection Forms link. Next, click on the link Attachment 6 Under 20KW App Agreement Cert Terms Sketch. This will open a document called the Interconnection Request Application and Agreement Form for Interconnecting a Certified Inverter-Based Generating Facility No Larger than 20 kW. This form gives notice to the cooperative of the member's intent to interconnect a generating facility as well as the terms and conditions of the interconnection agreement.

Please make sure the following steps are completed before submitting

an Interconnection Agreement request: Fill out the Interconnection Request Application and Agreement Form for Interconnecting a Certified Inverter-Based Generating Facility No Larger than 20 kW. Pay the \$100 nonrefundable processing fee. Then, contact your county inspections office to determine applicable regulations. If you live in a subdivision with a homeowner's association, review any of their requirements.

Also, submitted documents should include an attachment of equipment specifications and an electrical drawing of the proposed installation. You should purchase proper insurance, which can be found in section seven of the interconnection request form. Members should have their installers review the installation schematics, found on page 8 of the interconnection request form.


